- 7b. Briefly describe the present *physical description* of the site or structure and describe any major alterations from its original condition:

This bungalow at 1006 South Belle Avenue, built on a rectangular basement, has clapboard siding and a moderately pitched front-facing gable roof with three purlins spaced under the eaves. Seven narrow boards extend vertically from below the gable eaves to the fascia board that runs across the top of the balconied front porch which extends the width of the house and is contained beneath the main gable. Four square-turned posts support the porch shelter. The composition tiled roof may have replaced the original.
